

UKULELE STRUMMING LESSON 1 & 2

Strings

First string is closest to your lap and 4th string is closest to your chin



Tuning your ukulele

It is very important to tune your ukulele before each play. Consider investing in a TUNER to make it easier.

GCEA

G is on string 4 C is on string 3 E is on string 2 A is on string 1



Ukulele Strumming Lesson 2

Single Strum:

- remember loose wrist
- tuck 3 fingers into your palm and tuck your thumb onto your pointer finger
- play on the pointer finger.

Mute strum:

• Gently lay your 4 fingers of your left hand over the 4 strings of at the top of the neck of the ukulele. The lighter your 4 fingers are on the strings with the left hand, the better the percussion sound, you should hear no notes, just percussion

[C] Chord:

• use ring finger. Get that finger neatly in the middle of the fret & on the 1st string.
